Prices by class

Who paid more to be in Kos? Tourist or refugee? Tourists might be frustrated by the presence of refugees on their holiday spot.

The paradox is that the refugees have paid more than them, on average, to be in Kos

Tourist \$\$

Hotel + Flight + Food/other €50/day



= €1,100 per person /per week



Refugee \$\$\$\$

Boat from Turkey to Greece + cost from their country to Bodrum



= No less than €1,500 - €2,000 per person

Price conversion table

What does it mean for the refugees to spend €1,300 from Bodrum to Kos?

Country of origin	€1,300 in months of average national salary	The equivalent of
German, English, French	0.5 months	€1,300
Iranian	2.5 months	€6,500
Iraqi	3 months	€7,800
Syrian	7 months	€18,200
Pakistani	1 year	€31,200
Afghan	2 years	€62,400


Average monthly salary in Syria is \$220.

Asking €1,300 for the boat to a Syrian is like asking €18,200 to a West European.

When you have a middle-class family it means:

- either going alone and bringing your family later
- and/or selling all you've got
- or being heavily indebted with family and friends or with smugglers and work many years to reimburse, once in Europe.

But it seems worth it.



R.I.P

3,700 refugees drowned in the Mediterranean in 2015 (according to UNHCR), most of them due to smugglers overloading the boats
